Kaiser Makes Large Donation to Help Grief Victims

August 21, 2019 - (SAN JOSE, CA) Bill Wilson Center, a leader in homeless services for youth and young families in Santa Clara County, has received a \$50,000 donation from Kaiser Permanente to support BWC's Centre for Living with Dying program's efforts in providing grief support services in the aftermath of mass shootings in Gilroy and throughout the country.

After the Gilroy Garlic Festival tragedy, Kaiser Permanente wanted to help the community by supporting an organization that would provide wide emotional support to the Gilroy community.
