Josh Selo – Chief Executive Officer

Josh Selo comes to Bill Wilson Center from West Valley Community Services, a Cupertino-based nonprofit organization, where he was the agency's Executive Director. He is a Certified Fundraising Executive/CFRE with almost 25 years of experience in nonprofit leadership. Previously, Josh worked as the Associate Executive Director at the Palo Alto Family YMCA and the Chief Operating Officer of the JCC in Rockland County, New York. Josh has an MBA in Finance from Washington State University, an M.A.Ed. from the William Davidson Graduate School of Education, and a BFA in theater from UC Santa Barbara. He has served as the chair of the Cupertino Rotary Housing Corporation, a member of the Kiwanis Club of De Anza Cupertino Board, and a member of the Board of the Cupertino Chamber of Commerce. Josh was also the 2019 President of the Association of Fundraising Professionals Silicon Valley. Josh is a member of Showing Up For Racial Justice (SURJ) Bay Area, the Santa Clara County REAL (Race Equity Action Leadership) Coalition, and part of Cohort III of American Leadership Forums' Diversity, Inclusion, Equity, Leadership (DIEL) program. Josh was honored to receive the 2020 Cupertino Citizen of the Year and the 2020 Rotary Club of Cupertino Vocational Service Award.

Deborah Pell – Chief Program Officer

Debbie Pell has been a licensed Marriage and Family Therapist for 30 years. She has a Master's Degree in Education Psychology from California State University of Northridge. Prior to coming to Bill Wilson Center in 2001, Debbie was the Director of Children's Crisis Residential Program in Ventura County for Casa Pacifica. She began her employment with Bill Wilson Center as Director for Youth Residential Services. In 2011, she was promoted to Associate Director and in 2016, promoted again to the position of Chief Program Officer. Debbie has worked with at risk children through her entire career. She currently provides oversight and leadership for all agency programs and Performance, Quality and Improvement efforts. Debbie is currently participating in an updated law enforcement policy for addressing commercially sexually exploited minors and transitioning the Foster Family Agency and Group Homes in conformance to the legislative changes of AB 403, Continuum of Care Reform.

Pilar Furlong – Chief Community Resources Officer

With over 20 years of experience fundraising for non-profit agencies both large and small, Pilar's knowledge of the sector is both extensive and diverse. Currently serving as the Chief Community Resources Officer for Bill Wilson Center in Santa Clara County, Pilar oversees the fundraising, communications and marketing, and volunteer recruitment teams – ensuring that resources are in place to support and strengthen that advocacy. Aubrie is a CA Licensed Clinical Social Worker and Certified Therapist & Trainer in Parent-Child Interaction Therapy.

Deryk Clark – Division Director Youth Development Services

Bill Wilson Center's, Division Director of Youth Development Programs, Deryk Clark, has 28 years of experience working with homeless and street youth in Santa Clara County. In his current role at Bill Wilson Center he has primary oversight of all school based programs, as well as the agency's independent living skills program for foster youth and the agency's Youth Impact Partnership – a group of nine youth with lived experience who help guide program development while at the same time gaining leadership and advocacy skills and experience. In addition to his work at Bill Wilson Center, Deryk is a member of the Leadership Council for Santa Clara County Opportunity Youth Partnership Collaborative which addresses education and employment pathways for youth and young adults, a member of Santa Clara County School Link Services Collaborative to address and implement school based services for youth and families, and an Advisory Committee member for Santa Clara County Office of Education Opportunity Youth Academies.

Laura Foster, LCSW - Division Director of Research, Analysis and Impact

Laura Foster has been a Licensed Clinical Social Worker for 5 years. She has a Master's in Social Work from San Jose State University. Prior to joining Bill Wilson Center in 2007, Laura was the Transitional Housing Coordinator with Family Supportive Housing in San Jose. In the fall of 2016 Laura became the Division Director of Housing, providing oversight and leadership to eight housing programs and two school based programs. In 2021 she began her new role as Division Director of Research, Analysis and Impact.
